

Will Chicago Flip-Flop on Animal Cruelty?



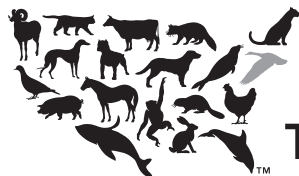
LAST YEAR, CHICAGO'S CITY COUNCIL BECAME A GLOBAL LEADER IN THE fight against cruelty when—by a vote of 48 to 1—it joined California and 15 countries in passing laws against foie gras. The vote showed that Chicagoans believe shoving pipes down birds' throats and force-feeding them until their livers expand more than 10 times their normal size is too inhumane to swallow.

But a year later, Mayor Richard Daley just won't move on. He wants to revisit the issue again and again, and he wants the City Council to flip-flop and bring animal cruelty back to Chicago. Doesn't Mayor Daley have more important things to do for the city than try to revive an inhumane fancy feast for rich fat cats?
