



KENTUCKY POLL RESULTS

625 Kentucky voters interviewed statewide by Mason-Dixon Polling & Research, Inc. of Washington, D.C. from January 7 through January 8, 2010. Margin for error is plus or minus 4%.

QUESTION: Cockfighting is illegal in all 50 states and a felony in about 80% of states. Kentucky, however, has one of the weakest penalties for cockfighting in the country, with the fines so low they are often the equivalent to a minor traffic ticket.

Would you support or oppose legislation that would increase the state penalty for illegal cockfighting to a felony?
