FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury.

***The ramp going into one of the pig enclosures has become detached from the cement it is usually attached to.
While in use during the inspection, it slid and fell into the gutter that is below the ramp. Animals using the detached ramp may become injured. The outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury.***

SANITATION.

(c) Housekeeping. Premises (buildings and grounds) shall be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart. Accumulations of trash shall be placed in designated areas and cleared as necessary to protect the health of the animals.

***In the pig and sheep enclosures, the paint used to seal both the cement blocks (pig area) and wooden structures (sheep area) has rubbed off in several areas along the back walls. The underlying material is exposed and cleaning as required cannot be done. Also, directly behind the pig enclosures there is a broken door and a metal corrugated fence that has a large hole in it. An animal coming in contact with this area may become injured. Premises shall be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart. Accumulations of trash shall be placed in designated areas and cleared as necessary to protect the health of the animals. ***
