3.53 (a) (2) **REPEAT**

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Section 3.53 Primary enclosures. All primary enclosures for rabbits shall conform to the following requirements: (a) General. (2) Primary enclosures shall be constructed and maintained so as to enable the rabbits to remain dry and clean.

Noncompliant item 1 cited on the last inspection report has been corrected. Since the last inspection, rabbit #1527 was washed but the dealer failed to establish procedures to enable the rabbit to remain clean.

1. Animal Facility, rabbit section: Rabbit #1527 was observed to have fecal/urinary stains on the hind legs, posterior lumbar, and perineal areas, indicating the enclosure was not maintained in a manner to enable the rabbit to remain clean. [REPEAT NCI]

The following item is cited as of this inspection.

2. Animal Facility, rabbit section: Rabbit #1373 was observed to have fecal/urinary stains on the hind legs and perineal areas, indicating the enclosure was not maintained in a manner to enable the rabbit to remain clean.

Animal facility/operating and husbandry procedures should enable the animals to remain clean and dry.

3.125 (a)

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Section 3.125(a) The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

1. Animal Facility, barn, enclosure C, housing 12 goats, 3 sheep, and 1 unregulated pony: The space between the lower metal rail of the enclosure and walkway was wide enough to allow escape from the enclosure and/or result in possible injury to the animals. One goat was observed to move in and out of the enclosure through the space.

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Animal facilities should be maintained in good repair to contain the animals, prevent injury to the animals, and to prevent further structural deterioration. Maintenance/repairs should be performed on a regular basis.

The facility should make the necessary repairs.

Correct by: Immediately.

3.131 (c) REPEAT SANITATION.

Section 3.131(c) Housekeeping. Premises (buildings and grounds) shall be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart.

Noncompliant Item 1 cited on the previous two inspection reports has been corrected. Since the last inspection, the concrete floor was painted. Several areas of the painted concrete floor were observed to be damaged again and are cited as of this inspection.

1. Animal Facility, large animal section, procedure room 110: Paint was missing from several areas of the concrete floor and platform, resulting in areas without paint or other sealant for cleaning and sanitization purposes [REPEAT NCI].

Noncompliant items 2.a., 2.b., 2.c.(1), 2.c.(2), cited on the last inspection report have been corrected. Since the last inspection, the enclosure walls were cleaned and painted. The walls were observed to be dirty and stained again and are cited as of this inspection.

2. Animal Facility, barn.

a. Animal enclosure A for housing animals: The painted masonry wall was dirty and stained. [REPEAT NCI]

b. Animal enclosure B, isolation pen, housing 1 sheep: The painted masonry wall was dirty and stained. [REPEAT NCI]

c. Animal enclosure C, housing 12 goats, 3 sheep, and 1 unregulated pony: The painted masonry wall at the left side of the enclosure was dirty and stained. [REPEAT NCI]

The facility should make the necessary repairs.

Animal inventory: 158 rabbits, 12 goats, 4 sheep, 2 llama.
