***** Approximately sixteen feet of fencing between two of the goat/sheep enclosures on the South end of the exercise pasture areas has broken wire with exposed wire ends extending into both enclosures. Approximately half of the broken fencing has been patched but exposed wire ends were also observed in the patched area. The fencing at this location is not in a good state of repair and the exposed wire ends could cause injury to the animals contained in the enclosures. Approximately twenty animals could be affected. Repair and/or replace the broken enclosure fencing.
