INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).

2.31(d) IACUC review of activities involving animals.

(1) In order to approve proposed activities or proposed significant changes in ongoing activities, the IACUC shall conduct a review of those components of the activities related to the care and use of animals and determine that the proposed activities are in accordance with this subchapter unless acceptable justification for a departure is presented in writing.

*** The principal investigator for Protocol 2510 is not following the written description of the proposed use of the animals as approved by the IACUC. The narrative describes a protocol which provides scientific justification for unrelieved pain (Category E). In a discussion with an IACUC member, it was stated that the protocol is not followed as written and the animals are given pain relief for more than momentary pain (Category D). This fact is not reflected in the most current IACUC approved protocol. The IACUC must ensure that protocols are properly reviewed and followed as approved and if significant changes are made, that those changes are reflected in the protocol narrative.

2.31(e) A proposal to conduct an activity involving animals, or to make a significant change in an ongoing activity involving animals, must contain the following:

(2) A rationale for involving animals, and for the appropriateness of the species and numbers of animals to be used

*** 2 protocols (2538, 2476) did not adequately provide a rationale for the number of animals to be used in the study. Protocol 2538 was described as a pilot study but did not indicate why the number of animals used was necessary. Protocol 2476 stated that the minimum number of animals used was based on the sponsor's request which is not sufficient justification. The number of animals required should be clearly and scientifically justified to assure that no more animals are used than are necessary for scientific

validity. All proposals to conduct an activity involving animals must contain a rationale for the numbers of animals to be used and the rationale must be made available to the inspector at the time of inspection.

3.6 (a) (2) (x)

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Primary enclosures for dogs and cats must meet the following minimum requirements:

(a) General requirements.

(2) Primary enclosures must be constructed and maintained so that they:

(x) Have floors that are constructed in a manner that protects the dogs' and cats' feet and legs from injury, and that, if of mesh or slatted construction, do not allow the dogs' and cats' feet to pass through any openings in the floor;

*** 2 enclosures in the outdoor earthen-floored runs containing 1 dog each had areas of eroded soil exposing a wire cattle panel. This wire panel is elevated off the soil to the point that the dogs' feet pass through the openings. All flooring must be constructed in a manner that protects the animal's feet from injury. The cattle panel must be removed or the flooring must be adequately maintained so that it is completely covered by soil.
