c) IACUC Functions. With respect to activities involving animals, the IACUC, as an agent of the research facility, shall:

- (1) Review, at least once every six months, the research facility's program for humane care and use of animals, using title 9, chapter I, subchapter A--Animal Welfare, as a basis for evaluation;
- (2) Inspect, at least once every six months, all of the research facility's animal facilities, including animal study areas, using title 9, chapter I, subchapter A-Animal Welfare, as a basis for evaluation; Provided, however, That animal areas containing free-living wild animals in their natural habitat need not be included in such inspection;

- 1) There was no semi-annual IACUC Program Review performed.
- 2) There was no semi-annual facilities inspection.

The IACUC should perform one of its key functions of supervising the animal welfare by examining the animal facilities and program review every 6 months as required under the regulations.

The IACUC, shall, every 6 months perform a semi-annual facilities inspections and program review.

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

SANITATION.

(c) Housekeeping. Premises (buildings and grounds) shall be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart. Accumulations of trash shall be placed in designated areas and cleared as necessary to protect the health of the animals.

The barn area was covered with heavy fecal buildup and dirt. The two back paddock areas had trash and debris littering the ground. There was an old pallet in the male sheep pen area. There were boards piled up against the outside of the barn area.

It is important to the health and well-being of the animals to live in areas that are devoid of trash, heavy fecal accumulation and foreign objects cable of being ingested.

All the animal contained areas should be well maintained by having trash, old wood boards, roof shingles and other debris picked up regularly and placed in designated areas.
