INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).

A proposal to conduct an activity involving animals, or to make a significant change in an ongoing activity involving animals, must contain for the appropriateness the numbers of animals to be used.

****BIOL3506:** The justification for number of animals used simply states that the number will provide "statistically significant results using the materials and titers of interest." The statement is insufficient to determine if the number of animals is appropriate. Additional information such as previous studies, statistics programs used to determine numbers/group, and is needed to ensure that viable research is conducted. The protocol should be amended and reviewed to ensure the numbers of animals proposed is appropriate and meets the standards set forth in Subpart 2.31 of the Animal Welfare Act. Correct by October 20, 2007.

CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

Hard surfaces of primary enclosures and food and water receptacles must be sanitized using one of the following methods:

- Live steam under pressure;
- Washing with hot water (at least 180 °F (82.2 °C)) and soap or detergent, such as in a mechanical cage washer;
- Washing all soiled surfaces with appropriate detergent solutions or disinfectants, or by using a combination detergent/disinfectant product that accomplishes the same purpose, with a thorough cleaning of the surfaces to remove organic material, so as to remove all organic material and mineral buildup, and to provide sanitization followed by a clean water rinse.

reach the required 180 degrees from mid March 2007 to mid May 2007. The problem was first addressed on 4/26/07, as part of the scheduled maintenance check. There is also no documentation of the measures taken to ensure the caging was adequately sanitized. The facility SOP does not address the steps to take if the temperature of the washer does not reach 180 degrees. The problem was not reported to the responsible party in an appropriate time frame, thus there is the possibility that cages were inadequately sanitized during the time that the cagewasher was faulty. Proper sanitization is necessary to prevent illness and minimize disease hazards. Measures must be taken to ensure that all caging is sanitized in accordance with section 3.84b of the Animal Welfare Act for the overall health of the animals.

EMPLOYEES.

The employees who provide husbandry practices and care, or handle nonhuman primates, must be trained and supervised by an individual who has the knowledge, background, and experience in proper animal husbandry and care to supervise others.
