FACILITIES, INDOOR.

Interior surfaces. The interior building surfaces of indoor housing facilities shall be constructed and maintained so that they are substantially impervious to moisture and may be readily sanitized.

***Building B - Cagewash: The walls are made of 12x12 ceramic tiles. The tiles are not sealed and the 1/2" spacing between each tile is not filled or sealed. Thus, the wall is not impervious to moisture. Interior building surfaces must be impervious to moisture to facilitate the cleaning and sanitization practices and to prevent the harborage or attraction of pests and vermin. The cagewash wall must be rendered impervious to moisture by either grouting and sealing the tiles or using another material that will render the wall impervious to moisture to facilitate prescribe husbandry practices. ENVIRONMENT ENHANCEMENT TO PROMOTE PSYCHOLOGICAL WELL-BEING.

Special considerations. Certain nonhuman primates must be provided special attention regarding enhancement of their environment, based on the needs of the individual species and in accordance with the instructions of the attending veterinarian. Nonhuman primates requiring special attention are those that show signs of being in psychological distress through behavior or appearance.

*** AZ91 has hair loss over 90% of the body, including the front legs. Records from the vendor indicate the condition was identified prior to arrival at Spring Valley Labs. Minimal enrichment has been provided to this animal.

***00R0960 has missing hair on shoulders and legs. Minimal enrichment has been provided to this animal.

Both animals show signs of psychological distress. According to the facility enrichment plan, animals showing signs of distress will be evaluated and a treatment plan established for the animals, which may include more complex enrichment items and cage position changes. Animals showing signs of psychological distress should be evaluated and an appropriate enrichment plan established to meet the individual needs of the animal. The two animals but must be evaluated by the attending veterinarian and a alternate enrichment plan established and maintained for the overall health and well-being of these animals.
