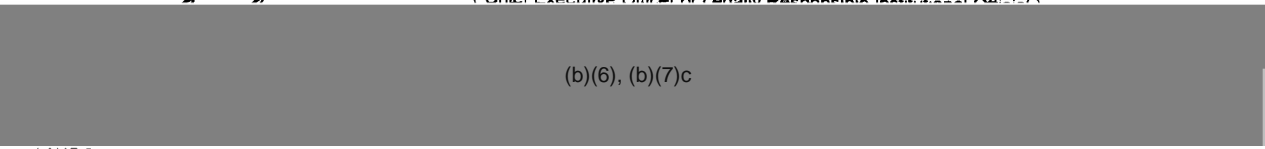

Subject U of Nebraska-Lincoln Annual Report

Dear Ms. Kovar:

The letter from Dr. Gibbens dated December 17, 2008, regarding missing information in our Annual Report of Research Facility, Customer ID 1552, Registration No. 47-R-0004, was received while the University was closed for the holidays. Hence, I am responding on our first day of work following the break. An explanation of entries in column E was not included in the annual report. The following text contains the information not included to provide an explanation of the procedures producing Category E pain in pocket gophers listed in column E in our 2008 Annual Report of Research Facility:

“The research project is designed to compare efficacy of two types of “lethal traps” used to capture pocket gophers in either a harvested alfalfa field or a grazed grass pasture environment. No “live traps” are available for capture of the pocket gopher, which is considered an agricultural pest. If the animals are not dead when traps are regularly checked, the animals are euthanized using carbon dioxide from a compressed gas cylinder, in a container into which the trap and animal are placed.”

Please let me know if additional information is needed. I thank you in advance for your assistance in completion of our annual report.
