A proposal to conduct an activity involving animals must contain a complete description of the proposed use of the animals.

The rabbit protocol (#103) describes using 30-40 mg/ kg Pentobarbital IV for euthanasia on page 10. However, on page 11 the dose is listed as 125mg/ kg IV. The doses in the protocol must be consistent so there is no confusion regarding what is done with animals.

INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).

Section 2.31(c)(3) IACUC: The IACUC shall prepare reports of its evaluations conducted as required by paragraphs (c)(1) and (2) of this section, and submit the reports to the Institutional Official of the research facility. The reports shall be reviewed and signed by a majority of the IACUC members and must include any minority views. The reports shall be updated at least once every six months upon completion of the required semiannual evaluations. The reports must contain a description of the nature and extent of the research facility's adherence to this subchapter, must identify specifically any departures from the provisions of title 9, chapter I, subchapter A--Animal Welfare, and must state the reasons for each departure. The reports must distinguish significant deficiencies from minor deficiencies. If program or facility deficiencies are noted, the reports must contain a reasonable and specific plan and schedule with dates for correcting each deficiency.

The October 2006 IACUC report to the Institutional Official was not signed by the IACUC members. The inspection concerns documented in the attached October meeting minutes were not given correction dates and a majority of the IACUC members did not attend the October 2006 meeting. The April 2006 IACUC report was only signed by four of the twelve IACUC members. All IACUC reports to the Institutional Official must be reviewed and signed by a majority of the IACUC members and include correction dates for all deficiencies found during the inspection and program review to comply with the Animal Welfare regulations.
