SANITATION.

CLEANING AND SANITATION OF PRIMARY ENCLOSURES. Primary enclosures shall be cleaned and sanitized often enough to prevent an accumulation of excreta or debris.

Several guinea pig cages in Room #5 were noted to have accumulations of feces piled up in the corner. The cages need to be cleaned and sanitized frequently enough to prevent accumulations of excreta and debris.

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

The floors of the primary enclosures shall be constructed so as to protect the rabbits' feet and legs from injury.

- There are two rabbits (#798 and #801) that are being housed in Room #6 that have one slat each missing from the cage floor. The missing vertical slat has created a gap in the flooring about 1" wide. The rabbits are small in size (about 2 kg) and could easily stick a limb through the gap, which could lead to injury.

-There are a number of rabbits in Room #6 that are housed in cages with inappropriate flooring. The two styles of flooring include vertical slats and large square grids. The rabbits are small in size (about 2 kg) and several of them were observed to have their feet partially protruding through the slats and grids, which could lead to injury. Other rabbits were housed in cages with smaller grid floors which were more suitable for their size.

The rabbits need to be moved to cages with suitable flooring and the broken slats must be repaired. The other rabbits also need to be moved into cages with appropriate flooring for their size.

The missing slats were replaced during the time of inspection.

INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).

Section 2.31(d)(2) IACUC: Prior to IACUC review, each member of the Committee shall be provided with a list of proposed activities to be reviewed. Written descriptions of all proposed activities that involve the care and use of animals shall be available to all IACUC members, and any member of the IACUC may obtain, upon request, full Committee review of those activities. If full Committee review is not requested, at least one member of the IACUC, designated by the chairman and qualified to conduct the review, shall review those activities, and shall have the authority to approve, require modifications in (to secure approval), or request full Committee review of any of those activities. If full Committee review is requested for a proposed activity, approval of that activity may be granted only after review, at a convened meeting of a quorum of the IACUC, and with the approval vote of a majority of the quorum present. No member may participate in the IACUC review or approval of an activity in which that member has a conflicting interest (e.g., is personally involved in the activity), except to provide information requested by the IACUC, nor may a member who has a conflicting interest contribute to the constitution of a quorum.

The IACUC at this facility has four voting members so three members constitute a quorum. At the July 19, 2007 IACUC meeting there were three voting members present. However, one voting member was the study director (principal investigator) for the animal activity proposals reviewed and can not contribute to the constitution of the quorum. The IACUC did not have sufficient voting members present to review the animal activity proposals. The IACUC needs to have sufficient voting members present (a quorum) to be able to review animal activity proposals at their meetings to comply with the animal welfare regulations.

There is no IACUC approved animal activity proposal for animals used as blood donors for study CP-HM. All live covered animals must have an IACUC approved proposal prior to the start of the study to ensure compliance with the Animal Welfare regulations and to minimize animal pain and distress.

Section 2.31(d)(1)(ii) IACUC: The principal investigator has considered alternatives to procedures that may cause more than momentary or slight pain or distress to the animals, and has provided a written narrative description of the methods and sources, e. g., the Animal Welfare Information Center, used to determine that alternatives were not available.

The facility's animal activity proposals that may cause animals to experience pain or distress do not have a written narrative description from the principal investigator of the methods and sources used to determine that alternative were not available. The following proposals with animals reported in Category E on the 2006 Annual Report had no written search for alternatives: SP-32JMHW, SP-10OPPTS, SP-32R95, SP-20JMHW, AP-I-4, and AP-III-1. Principal investigators for animal proposals that may cause animals more than momentary pain or distress must provide a written narrative description of their search used to determine alternatives were not available to provide the IACUC with the necessary information to review the proposal and ensure animal pain or distress is minimized.
