Future IACUC reports must state if deficiencies are significant or minor and include correction dates with the plans for correcting the deficiencies to comply with the Animal Welfare regulations. ENVIRONMENT ENHANCEMENT TO PROMOTE PSYCHOLOGICAL WELL-BEING.

Section 3.81 Environment enhancement: Research facilities must develop, document, and follow an appropriate plan for environment enhancement adequate to promote the psychological well-being of nonhuman primates. The plan must be in accordance with the currently accepted professional standards as cited in appropriate professional journals or reference guides, and as directed by the attending veterinarian.

The facility's plan for environment enhancement includes resting platforms for the animals which is in accordance with currently accepted professional standards. Six animals in room 6 did not have resting platforms. The other animals in the facility with resting platforms were on the resting platforms during this inspection. These six animals need to be provided resting platforms to ensure their well-being.

Section 2.31(d)(5) IACUC: The IACUC shall conduct continuing reviews of activities covered by this subchapter at appropriate intervals as determined by the IACUC, but not less than annually.

The last documented IACUC review and approval of animal activity proposal BT&T provided during this inspection was in the IACUC meeting minutes for April 24, 2006. Proposals must be reviewed and approved by the IACUC at least once a year to comply with the animal welfare regulations and to ensure the well-being of the animals. Correct by July 16, 2007.

RECORDKEEPING REQUIREMENTS.

Section 2.35(a) Recordkeeping requirements: The research facility shall maintain the following IACUC records:

(1) Minutes of IACUC meetings, including records of attendance, activities of the Committee, and Committee deliberations;

(2) Records of proposed activities involving animals and proposed significant changes in activities involving animals, and whether IACUC approval was given or withheld.

During this inspection there were no IACUC meeting minutes available for review after April of 2006. There was also no record for the annual review and approval for animal activity proposal BT&T since April 24, 2006. The IACUC Chairperson was reached by telephone during this inspection. The Chairperson confirmed that the IACUC met last October and April and believed that the IACUC had performed the annual review for proposal BT&T. However, there were no records available during this inspection. Records of IACUC meeting minutes and approval of proposals must be kept as required by the animal welfare regulations to ensure compliance. Correct by July 16, 2007.

INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).

(a) The Chief Executive Officer of the research facility shall appoint an Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC), qualified through the experience and expertise of its members to assess the research facility's animal program, facilities, and procedures.

An IACUC has not been appointed by the CEO/IO of this facility for site 002. A key administrative member of this facility was advised in June 2009 of the specific criteria for IACUC appointment and function that is necessary to achieve compliance at this new site under the Animal Welfare Act. Establishment of a functioning IACUC committee is paramount for maintenance of a research registration under the Animal Welfare Act and essential to ensure the well being of any regulated animal held under that registration.

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE.

(a) Each research facility shall have an attending veterinarian who shall provide adequate veterinary care to its animals in compliance with this section:

(1) Each research facility shall employ an attending veterinarian under formal arrangements.

The facility currently has no formal arrangement for the employment of an attending veterinarian. Provisions are in place for routine husbandry and basic veterinary care of facility animals in their current housing situation. However, this oversight excludes interpreting the veterinary services as formal retention of an attending veterinarian for the research facility according to the veterinarian providing these services.

The responsibilities of an attending veterinarian for a research facility include (but are not limited to) consultation and development of guidelines for principal investigators and other personnel on all animal related activities, determining the research policy on necropsies and developing policies on expired drug use and/or disposal. It was apparent during this inspection that the clinical veterinary services currently provided to the facility animals do not include the

above described responsibilities.

An attending veterinarian must be formally engaged by the facility to ensure adequate veterinary services as determined by the definition and function of an attending veterinarian under a research registration as required under the Animal Welfare Act.
