#### INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).

(e) A proposal to conduct an activity involving animals must contain the following:

(3) A complete description of the proposed use of the animals.

1) Page 9 of ACUP NUMBER 702321 states that buprenorphine is to be used as a post-operative analgesic and is to be administered at a frequency of every 12 hrs for the first 12 hrs.

In Section IV, ALTERNATIVES, on page 11 it is mentioned that the animals are given post-operative analgesics during the first 12-24 hours.

In response to the choice of analgesic to be used (if necessary) during the second 12 hr post-operative period, the Director of Animal Resources stated that it was Tylenol; however the use of this drug is not mentioned in the protocol itself.

For the health and welfare of the animals, the protocol should clearly state when and which drugs are to be administered, if applicable, with an explanation.

#### CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

Housekeeping for premises. Premises where housing facilities are located must be kept clean in order to facilitate the husbandry practices required in this subpart.

1) A cart used to hold environmental enrichment material in the room housing the nonhuman primates had an accumulation of dust and other debris. The accumulation potentially could contribute to the growth of disease agents. For the health of the animals this hazard should be corrected.
