PERSONNEL QUALIFICATIONS.

It shall be the responsibility of the research facility to insure that all scientists, research technicians, animal technicians and other personnel involved in animal care, treatment and their use are qualified to perform their duties. During the weekend of Aug 4-5 2007 the husbandry tech on duty had to receive instructions over the phone as to dosages to use for pre-anesthetics and euthansia solution. This would signify that the person was not properly trained in this procedure.

The facility needs to ensure its personnel are properly trained in their required responsibilities and need to document its training.

The written program of veterinary care dated 7/25/05 does not indicate the frequency of visits by the attending veterinarian.

The facility need to insure the program of veterinary care is complete and followed.

Note the individual representing the facility on the program of vet care has since retired therefore a new person representing the facility must sign off on it.

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE.

Each research facility shall establish and maintain a program of adequate vet care which includes the use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose and treat disease and injuries and the ability of emergency, weekend and holiday care.

Item During the weekend of Aug 4-5/07 due to unforeseen circumstances both the consulting vet and the backup vet were both out of town. The facility had an emergency with one swine, involving a prolapse rectum. While the animal did receive pain medication on the 4 of Aug. records show a manual reduction was tried on the 5 of Aug. by the the PI with no success. The animal was euthanized on the 5th.

Due to the absence of both veterinarians the animal was not able to receive the proper curative treatment or be euthanized at an earlier time.

Item another swine id 17318 had a similar procedure and according to med records recovered with no problems but was found dead on 8/4/07

With both vets out of town there was no way to determine the cause of death.

Item The facility program of vet care indicates that the veterinarian will be responsible for the euthansia of sick animals.

The facility needs to establish and maintain a system of veterinary coverage so that even if both the consulting vet and the back up vet are out of town there will be a veterinarian present to treat or euthanize animals.

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Item Swine id 17318 and 17319 had a procedure on 8/3/07, the protocol indicates a Fentanyl patch will be used. There is no documentation in the medical records that it was administered.

Item For the swine on protocol LA 0388 the protocol indicates buprenorphine will be given 0.01mg/kg s/q one dose after surgery
The post-op records for swine 17318 and 17319 were reviewed. They indicate buprenorphine was administered but there is no documentation as to dose, or route of administration.

Item Swine 17319 developed a prolapse rectum, medical records on 8/4/07 show the tech on duty made an entry as "as vet instructions extra pain killer was given and observed"
There is no mention as to what was given, how much was administered, or route of administration

Item Swine 17319 which was euthanized on 8/5/07. The medical records show rompun/ketamine was administered prior to euthansia solution. there is no documentation as to how much rompum/ketamine was given or how much euthansia solution was administered.

In order to provide proper post-op care , the facility needs to insure that all medication must be documented as to dose and route of administration.
