HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Structure; construction. Housing facilities for dogs and cats must be designed and constructed so that they are structurally sound. They must be kept in good repair, and they must protect the animals from injury.

*** The air conditioning unit in the outside exercise yard may pose a hazard for dogs that are allowed to run free in the area. Insulation covering the pipes in the unit appear deteriorated and may be ingested. Additionally a dog may get a paw caught between the pipes resulting in injury.

INDOOR HOUSING FACILITIES.

Interior surfaces. The floors and walls of indoor housing facilities, and any other surfaces in contact with the animals, must be impervious to moisture. The ceilings of indoor housing facilities must be impervious to moisture or be replaceable (e.g., a suspended ceiling with replaceable panels).

1) Cracks and peeling paint were noted on the walls in both the feline enrichment room and the second dog room. A damaged ceiling tile was also noted in the second dog room.

These areas are no longer impervious to moisture and thus can not be properly sanitized.

Proper sanitization is important to the health of the animals.
