FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Section 3.50(c) Storage: Supplies of food and bedding shall be stored in facilities which adequately protect such supplies against infestation or contamination by vermin.

In the room housing 6 rabbits there are two open boxes of treats and one open bag of shavings used for litter. The open boxes of treats can attract rodent pests and shavings can provide nesting material. During the past few years this facility had to increase its rodent pest control program. The open packages of supplies need to be stored in containers with tightly fitting lids to protect against spoilage and infestation or contamination by vermin.
