3.125 (a) **REPEAT**

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Section 3.125(a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

1. The noncompliant item cited on the last inspection report was not satisfactorily corrected. Barn pasture (lower pasture) housing 4 horses for teaching purposes, located alongside two roads: Several sections of the chain-link fence were again observed to be in disrepair, including wire mesh not secured to the top rails which created gaps in the fence. The detached wire mesh/gaps could entangle and cause injury to the horses and/or facilitate the entry of animals or unauthorized persons into the pasture. [REPEAT NCI]

2. Upper pasture for housing horses for teaching purposes: The bottom wire in the upper pasture/orchard fence was detached from most fence posts.

Animal facilities should be maintained and kept in good repair to prevent injury to the animals and to contain the animals. Maintenance/repairs should be performed on a regular basis.

The teaching facility should make the necessary repairs.

FACILITIES, GENERAL

Section 3.125(a) Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

1. Barn pasture for housing 4 horses for teaching purposes, located alongside two roads: Several areas of the chain-link fence were observed to be in disrepair. In at least three areas of the fence, the top rails were not secured to the vertical posts. In at least three other areas, the wire mesh was not secured to the top rails which created gaps in the fence. The gaps could entangle and cause injury to the horses and/or facilitate the entry of animals or unauthorized persons into the pasture.

Noncompliant items related to the disrepair of pasture fences were previously cited on recent inspection reports and are considered to be corrected at this time. In the future, the teaching facility should establish the necessary procedures to ensure that fences are maintained/repared to prevent injury, escape, and ensure the safety of the animals.

Animal facilities should be maintained and kept in good repair to prevent injury to the animals and to contain the animals. Maintenance/repairs should be performed on a regular basis.

The teaching facility should make the necessary repairs.
