ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE.

Section 2.33(b) Each research facility shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include:
(2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries.

1. Expired drugs/materials in the research facility.

a. Surgery suite, supply area, room 16101: Sodium chloride injection, 0.9%, 250 ml bags, lot #326439, expired 12/1997 (7); Polypropylene suture 4-0 with needle (Prolene), lot #DGE459, expired 1/2006 (6); Braided polyester suture with needle, lot #D8D494, expired 2004 (12).

b. Office, room 8119, lockbox: Pentobarbital sodium injection, 50 mg/ml, 50 ml vial, lot #24808Z721, expired 1/2008 (1).

The use of expired drugs, fluids, and medical materials is not considered to be acceptable veterinary practice and may adversely affect animal treatment.

SANITATION.

Section 3.56(c) Housekeeping. Premises (buildings and grounds) shall be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart.

1. Animal facility, cage wash room (soiled side), room 14610.

a. The floor surface was observed to be damaged/deteriorated in the area around the front floor drain.

b. The floor drain grills were moderately to severely rusted which cannot be adequately cleaned/sanitized.

Animal facilities should be maintained and kept in good repair to facilitate cleaning and sanitization, to reduce or eliminate entry and breeding of vermin, and to prevent further structural deterioration. Maintenance/repairs should be performed on a regular basis.

INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).

Section 2.31(d) IACUC review of activities involving animals. (1) In order to approve proposed activities or proposed significant changes in ongoing activities. . . The IACUC shall determine that the proposed activities or significant changes in ongoing activities meet the following requirements: (viii) Personnel conducting procedures on the species being maintained or studied will be appropriately qualified and trained in those procedures.

1. Review of animal records/training documents for Animal Care and Use Protocol 16406 which described a study involving pigs: Available records indicated that at least four persons, involved in the conduct of animal procedures, including anesthesia, anesthetic monitoring, surgery, and the use of a neuromuscular blocking agent, were not listed on the protocol. The records also failed to document or provide evidence that the individuals were properly trained and qualified to conduct the procedures.

The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee should ensure that all scientists, research personnel, or other personnel involved in the care and use of animals are qualified and appropriately trained.

2.33 (b) (5) REPEAT

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE.

Section 2.33(b) Each research facility shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include: (5) Adequate pre-procedural and post-procedural care in accordance with current established veterinary medical and nursing procedures.

Noncompliant item 1 cited on the last inspection report for the Center City Campus has not been satisfactorily corrected. Since the last inspection, the attending veterinarian established procedures to ensure anesthetic monitoring, as described in the proposal, and documentation of the monitoring procedures. The procedures were only partially implemented by research personnel to correct the noncompliant item. The following item, similar to the previously cited item, is cited as of this inspection.
