3.81(c) Special considerations. Certain nonhuman primates must be provided special attention regarding enhancement of their environment, based on the needs of the individual species and in accordance with the instructions of the attending veterinarian. Nonhuman primates requiring special attention are the following:...

(3) Those used in research for which the Committee-approved protocol requires restricted activity...

The 14 primates currently in this protocol are individually housed and are not provided access to toys, foraging boards or similar manipulanda. (Manipulanda restriction is explained in the protocol and approved by the IACUC). Additionally, animals are not allowed to have foodstuffs other than monkey biscuits, and "natural foods" such as nuts, fruits, vegetables. Innovative food items such as, but not limited to, frozen treats, high calorie Ensure-like drinks, etc., have not been allowed by the Principal Investigator. No appropriate reasoning has been provided in the protocol for this lack of food innovation/variety, and the IACUC has not approved these food restrictions. Aspects of the protocol procedures sometimes cause transitory weight loss in the primates. Access to more exciting, more innovative food items could help to preclude this weight loss problem and could also aid in contributing to the psychological well being of the primates.
