#### FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Structural Strength- Indoor housing facilities for rabbits shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair.- As noted on 6/26/07 inspection the wall board material to which the cages are attached is rotten and no longer provides proper support for cages and also cannot be properly cleaned and sanitized as they are not impervious to moisture.

Back wall of breeding room of facility is water-logged and rotting. This wall is no longer structurally sound and also cannot be cleaned and sanitized.

#### FACILITIES, INDOOR.

Indoor facilities housing rabbits shall be adequately ventilated to promote the health and well-being of the rabbits at all times.- During this inspection there was a strong ammonia odor permeating the facility. Facility must reduce amount of urine and fecal material pooling under cages which contribute greatly to the ventilation problem. Facility also needs to provide adequate forced ventilation to circulate air and improve ventilation.

Housekeeping- Premises shall be kept clean and in good repair to facilitate proper husbandry practices. There is continued accumulation of hair, fecal material, urine and water under the primary enclosures which contribute greatly to the strong ammonia odor in facility.
