Primary enclosures for dogs must meet the following minimum requirements:

- (a) General requirements.
- (2) Primary enclosures must be constructed and maintained so that they:
 - (ii) Protect the dogs from injury.

1) The chains securing the water buckets for the two dogs in the kennel room are attached to the chain link fencing in such a way that it would possible for the dogs to entangle a leg possibly causing injury.

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE.

Daily observation of all animals to assess their health and well-being; Provided, however, That daily observation of animals may be accomplished by someone other than the attending veterinarian; and Provided, further, That a mechanism of direct and frequent communication is required so that timely and accurate information on problems of animal health, behavior, and well-being is conveyed to the attending veterinarian.

- 1) A circular lesion about the size of a dime was noted on the left flank of a dog in the kennel room.
It is estimated that the lesion may have been there for several days.

The presence of the lesion was not noted in the daily observation book, nor was its presence communicated to the attending veterinarian.

Failure to adequately observe and communicate information can be detrimental to the health of the animals. Correct by reviewing observational procedures and methods of communication. By 6/18/08.

Surfaces

- 1) The water receptacle in one of the dog enclosures was noted to have worn edges - probably from having been chewed. In this condition the receptacle might have caused the animal injury and could not have been readily cleaned/sanitized.
