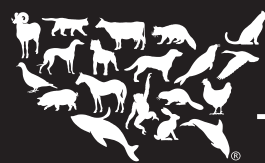




## Why is the egg industry playing Russian roulette with Americans' health?

Most eggs produced in the U.S. come from hens confined in cages so small they can't even spread their wings. Every scientific study in the last five years on this issue found that operations forcing hens to endure such extreme confinement had higher rates of *Salmonella* contamination than cage-free farms. The egg industry should stop cramming hens in cages. It's the least it can do for birds and consumers.
