In Hastings-on-Hudson, N.Y., most deer reports come from wealthier neighborhoods north of Hillside Park, where animals wander close to homes and residents tend to be less tolerant—they're recent transplants from New York City or have invested more in their yards. But the majority of the estimated 140 deer within and just over the village's borders live to the south, on the campuses of the Andrus Orchard School, a former farm, and the Andrus On Hudson senior care center. Working on the nursing home grounds and in and around Hillside Park, the HSUS's Rick Naugle aims to dart 56 does (80 percent) with the PZP contraceptive. Whether the project reduces deer numbers depends partly on how many deer from outside the area—Dobbs Ferry, Yonkers, or even Greenburgh across the Saw Mill River Parkway—migrate in.
