



## **New Hampshire Accomplishments (1995 through 2012)**

### **Legislation/Public Policy**

- The HSUS in New Hampshire has been advocating alongside other state and national coalition partners for the following legislation:
  - Spay/neuter assistance program (passed)
  - Ban on greyhound racing (passed)
  - Improvements to animal fighting law (passed)
  - Ban on dogs riding in the back of pick-up trucks (passed)
  - Spay/neuter month governor proclamation (passed)

### **Grants, Aid, and Project Contributions**

- The HSUS has provided over \$2,000 in grants to New Hampshire since 2009; going back 10 years, we have put over \$70,000 in grant dollars into organizations in New Hampshire and the surrounding states.

### **Training, Shelter, and Advocate Outreach and Events**

- Serve on the board of the New Hampshire Federation of Humane Organizations
- Regularly offer in-service workshops to shelter staff on topics such as compassion fatigue and disaster planning

### **Partnerships**

- The HSUS worked in cooperation with the Fisher Cats baseball team, based out of Manchester, on our Safe Cats Program. The package (funded by the Safe Cats campaign) included tickets for HSUS members, which were typically distributed to the state's shelters for their use or raffle, along with an on-air interview and table. Among the many people who visited our booth was the governor, and we signed up hundreds of new action alert team members through promotions at the game.
- The HSUS serves on the N.H. Governor's Commission on the Humane Treatment of Animals.
- The HSUS was a founding member of the NH Animal Fighting Taskforce.

### **Corporate Reform**

- Eleven pet store locations have signed our Puppy Friendly Pet Store Pledge.

### **Direct Assistance, Hands-On Care, Transport, or Placement**

- Offered technical assistance to the Newton Police Department and the N.H. SPCA after 43 pit bulls were seized from a professional animal fighting operation; the owner was convicted on both state and federal charges for animal cruelty, money laundering, and drug possession.

### **Disaster Planning and Response**

- Founding member and last sitting chair of the N.H. Disaster Animal Response Team
- Served on steering committee that drafted animal annex to statewide emergency response plan
- Regularly speak on emergency animal sheltering issues to groups throughout the state
- Hosted a 3-day Disaster Animal Response Team and 2-day Emergency Animal Sheltering training for New Hampshire DART members
