Frequently Asked Questions

When is the Walk?

Sunday, October 5, 2008. Check-in starts at 10:00 am; pre-walk activities begin at 11:00 am. The walk begins at noon.

Where is the Walk?

Constitution Gardens, just north of the World War II Memorial on the National Mall. When you arrive, please check-in at our tents located on the west side of the lake (and east of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial), along Constitution Ave. between 20th and 21st Streets NW (across from the Federal Reserve Board).

How much does it cost to register?

The registration fee is \$25 for individuals and \$60 for a family of 4 (no more than 2 adults ages 18 or older).

May I bring my dog?

Dogs are welcome! If you are considering bringing your canine companion, please review the following guidelines. Event officials reserve the right to refuse entry or eject any participant not in compliance:

- Participating dogs must be friendly, of good temperament and at least six months old. We also strongly recommend that dogs be spayed or neutered,
- The walk is between 1/2 and 3/4 of a mile long. Walkers and their dogs should be in suitable physical condition.
- All dogs must be current on rabies vaccinations.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash (6 feet or shorter) at all times. No retractable leashes. We also strongly recommend that dogs wear an identification tag.
- Dog watering stations will be provided.
- Please clean up after your dog. Pooper scooper bags will be provided.
- Do not leave dogs in parked cars at anytime.

May I bring my cat (or other type of pet)?


For their own safety, pets other than dogs are not allowed. However, we encourage you to stop by the Cosmic Catnip Kitty Café and pick up a treat to take home to your feline friend!

Will there be anything to eat?

There will be tasty treats for your canine companions and water for you. We encourage you to bring a snack or picnic lunch to enjoy on the lawn!

How long is the walk itself?

The walk is between 1/2 and 3/4 of a mile long and circles the lovely lake at Constitution Gardens, which has a bridge that leads to a small island and the 56 Signers of the Declaration of Independence Memorial.



Where do I park?

General parking is available on the streets near the Walk site and along Ohio Dr. between the Lincoln and Jefferson Memorials. Limited handicapped parking is available at the Lincoln and FDR Memorials. If you are not bringing a canine companion—or if you are bringing a small dog (20 lbs. or less)*—we encourage you to take Metro, as parking is limited in the National Mall area. Take Metro to the Smithsonian station on the Blue/Orange lines. Upon exiting the station walk toward and then past the Washington Monument. When you cross 17th Street walk north past the World War II Memorial (it will be on your left) and then turn left into Constitution Gardens and toward the lake. The check-in tents will be located on the other side of the lake. Police academy cadets will be on hand to point the way.

**Metro permits small animals to be carried free of charge, provided they are securely enclosed in a pet carrier sufficiently small enough (20 lbs. or less) to be carried without danger or offense to other passengers.*
